

SAINTS OF THE WEEK: St Helen (d.328) mother of the emperor Constantine. She became a Christian, and when her son became master of the East, she made a pilgrimage to Jerusalem. She directed excavations beneath Calvary, finding remnants of the true Cross.

St John Eudes, born on 14 November 1601 at Rye (Orne) in France, was educated by the Jesuits. Ordained priest, he founded in 1643 the Congregation of the Priests of Jesus and Mary called Eudists, and in 1644, the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Charity. As preacher, writer and founder, he promoted the public worship of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. He died at Caen on 19 August 1680, was beatified in 1909 and canonized in 1925.



St Bernard was the son of a Burgundian nobleman who became a Cistercian monk, a branch of the Benedictine order. He founded a new monastery in the forests of Clairvaux which numbered 700 monks by his death. At the Pope's request he travelled round Europe

engaged in monastic reform and church affairs. His sermons earned him the title *Doctor mellifluous* (the honey-tongued Doctor). He preached the second crusade and died at Clairvaux in 1153.

St Pius X: Joseph Sarto was born at Riese in Venetia on 2 June 1835. He was successively curate, parish priest, bishop of Mantua, patriarch of Venice, and Pope from 1903 to 1914: "I was born poor, I have lived poor, and I wish to die poor." He allowed children to receive First Holy Communion from the age of reason, about seven, and promoted Gregorian chant.

THE CATHOLIC CHURCH'S BEST KEPT SECRET

Last month the Catholic Herald published an article under the above headline. It was an account by a Catholic journalist, Damian Thompson, of a recent personal experience of the SVP. The article is well worth a read – it is touching, interesting and informative. It is too long to reproduce here in full, but there are a number of printed copies of the piece in the Resource area.

Damian writes, "I have spent many years writing about the Catholic Church: its battles with secularism, its internal disputes and, inevitably the scandals it brought upon itself. But not one of my articles made mention of the SVP, which in England and Wales alone makes more than half a million visits a year to vulnerable people in their communities. That statistic is remarkable – but even more special is the self-effacing yet unambiguously Catholic ethos of the SVP. That ethos inspires and equips ordinary people to perform acts of kindness in countries all over the world. It's one of the things that makes the Church catholic; it's as much a part of the fabric of the faith as any cathedral or liturgy. In a way, it is a liturgy.

And, even though members of my own family had been devoted to the SVP, I ignored it - until the moment when Angela (from SVP) came sailing into that hospital ward with a miraculously sunny smile on her face."

SVP will be having an "Awareness Month" in September to tell us more about their work and appeal for new members.
